## Depot fundraising a creative endeavor

**H**ow do we raise money for the Depot? Any way we can!

First, a number of people have made pledges for our support, which is vital because it gives us a baseline of income that we use to form a budget covering rent, utilities, and other basic expenses. Second, we solicit non-pledge donations through holiday giving and matching grant campaigns. Third, we apply for grants offered to organizations like ours. These are not for day-to-day operational expenses but instead for special items that enhance our mission—such as money to buy beds for our guests. Fourth, although we make pickups for free, we do ask people to consider giving a donation toward gas and truck maintenance.

Finally, throughout the year, we hold various fund-raising events.

One such event happened at the end of September at the **Apollo Grill** in historic Bethlehem. This upscale bistro regularly hosts “Therapeutic Thursday” events, which can be used as fundraisers for local charities. The Depot event was a fun evening full of fellowship that netted \$1,380 for the Depot! A huge THANK YOU to Donna

Giardina—and to the Apollo Grill—for making this event possible.

The **Depot Sidewalk Sale**, another recent fundraiser, was a HUGE success! Collectibles and other wonderful items

such as jewelry, linens, and framed artwork were given to the Depot over the past year specifically for us to sell. This we did at the **Bethlehem Historic District Sidewalk** sale held in mid-September. Ginny and Ernie Josar and other volunteers who love helping and shopping at yard sales organized our items and worked on sale day, earning valuable funds for the Depot and publicizing our work. The sale garnered \$700, which we used to purchase items for cleaning bags, personal-care kits, kitchen items, and additional disaster relief kits that we send to crisis areas wherever they are needed. Because of this success, we plan to make this annual event into a sale that focuses on collectibles. If you have collectibles you no longer want, consider donating them to us—at any time of the year—and we will use them to support our budget.



While we do not encourage families to bring children to the Depot, they often have no other choice. So, in the spirit of serving individuals and families, we do whatever we can to help—even if it means carrying the tiniest next to our hearts.

Recently, within a two-week time frame, we served two families with young babies at the Depot. One family brought a two-day-old baby (ahhh!) with 2 older sisters; the other a 2-week-



old baby snuggled to Mom's chest with 5 siblings waiting at home. Both families desperately needed furniture due to unexpected events in their lives. While the mom in one family and the dad in the other selected items, our volunteers talked to, held, walked, and cuddled these bundles of joy.

We prayed that these tiny little girls would learn to know God and, as they grow, share their love with those in need.
